

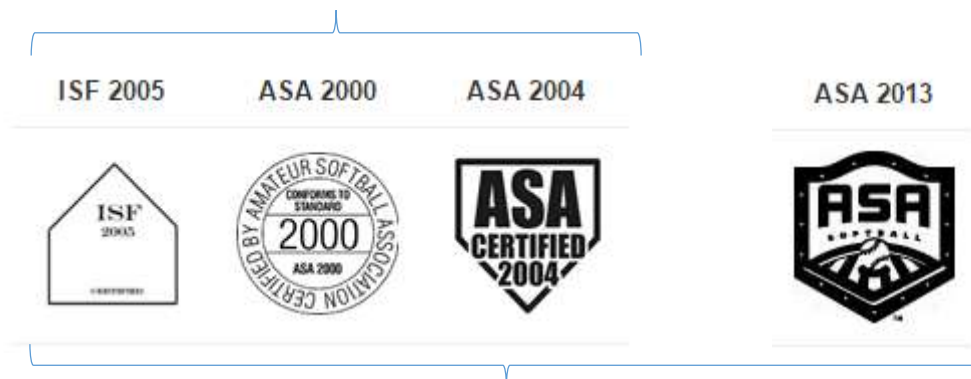


# Fast Pitch Bat Check Protocol

Updated March 2017

If a bat has an ISF 2005 certification stamp or an ASA 2000 or ASA 2004 certification stamp it is approved for use, unless it is one of the 15 bats shown on the **Softball Canada Non-Approved Bat List**. Adult men (U21 and above) may also use bats with an ASA 2013 certification stamp.

**All female categories & male categories up to U18**



**Adult male categories – U21 and above**

**All other bats are not approved for use.** Non-approved Bats should be removed from competition and given to the scorekeeper. Teams should be advised that they may pick the bat up after the game at the scorer's table.

Notes:

- The **Softball Canada Non-Approved Bat List** includes those bats on the USA Softball Non-Approved with ASA Certification Stamp list that also do not appear on the WBSC Approved Bat list.
- Bats must meet all other requirements. (e.g. no cracks, severe dents, excessive wear, excessive tape, etc.)



# Slo-Pitch Bat Check Protocol

Updated June 2016

If a bat has an ISF 2005 certification stamp or an ASA 2000, ASA 2004 or ASA 2013 certification stamp it is approved for use, unless it is one of the 15 bats shown on the **Softball Canada Non-Approved Bat List**.



**All other bats are not approved for use.** Non-approved Bats should be removed from competition and given to the scorekeeper. Teams should be advised that they may pick the bat up after the game at the scorer's table.

Notes:

- The **Softball Canada Non-Approved Bat List** includes those bats on the ASA Non-Approved with ASA Certification Stamp list that also do not appear on the ISF Approved Bat list.
- Bats must meet all other requirements. (e.g. no cracks, severe dents, excessive wear, excessive tape, etc.)
